Entry requirements

Applicants must have one of the following:

- A first degree from an approved university or equivalent institution OR
- An appropriate postgraduate diploma awarded at an approved institution OR
- A professional qualification and evidence of advanced professional standing and experience in EFL

Plus

- Normally two years' experience in an appropriate context
- Overseas applicants will normally have a minimum of 6.5 in IELTS with a minimum of 6.0 in all sub-tests.

Fees

The following fees are applicable for 2011/12. A small increase can be expected for subsequent years

Full-time Home/EU students – MA/MEd	£4,270
Full-time non-EU students – MA/MEd	£10,100
Part-time fee per 20-credit module (Home/EU)	£480
Dissertation, 60 credits	£1,440
